Principal's Report

Thanks to everyone who was able to get to our Information Evenings this week. It was great to see so many families finding out about how we can work as a team to support student learning and engagement here at school. The messages by our teaching teams gave parents great insights to learning approaches and home school partnership practices to help with clarity of expectations of home learning, diary use and a range of other information.

Next week we start our "Get to Know You" meetings on Monday and Tuesday. These meetings will provide parents with the chance to share knowledge about children with teachers and to clarify any specific goals. In the Middle and Senior School meetings, students can play a part in the process by coming along and adding their voice to a part of the meeting or in fact the entire conference. Student voice is a key factor in learning and teaching relationships and student understanding of expectations and goals supports clarity with home school partnerships. With our younger students in Prep -Year 2 it is not expected that students attend at our "Get to Know You" meetings but they will attend mid-year learning conferences to play a role in the conference meetings.

Please book a time slot to meet with your child's teacher using our compass portal. If you are unable to make a time on the dates provided, please ensure you arrange a different time to talk together about your child's learning and goals at another time.

Curriculum Day-Tuesday March 12th

We will be holding a Curriculum Day this Term on Tuesday March 12th the day after Labour Day holiday for staff to participate in whole school professional learning on the THRASS spelling, phonemic approach. This work directly ties into our school's 2019 AIP-Annual Implementation Plan to develop greater consistency of learning and teaching practice in Reading approaches throughout the levels of our school to improve student outcomes in the Reading and Viewing curriculum area.

Assistant Principal Report

Information Evenings

Many thanks are extended to all parents/guardians who attended the Information Evenings for their children and special thanks to our staff who made themselves available after hours for this purpose. Although these information sessions are very helpful to both teachers and parents alike, it is self-evident that the children are the real beneficiaries of parents and teachers working in partnership towards understanding how our classrooms operate and the valuable programs provided to ensure our students are not only engaged with their learning but have a quality learning program provided.

Common sense to Cybersense

With the recent government announcement about new educational programs being provided I thought it timely to include these simple tips to assist with the use of technology at home. Translating what we already know to cyberspace. Already with too much on their plates, we can't expect every parent to sit at their children's side every second they are online. We have work and other obligations. And while we need to supervise what they do, we also need to find ways to do this without having to earn a Ph.D. in computer science.

How can we take what our grandparents taught our parents and our parents taught us and apply it to cyberspace? It's easier than you think. Keeping your children safe online isn't about technology, it's about common sense and communication.

Don't talk to or accept anything from strangers. Online, everyone is a stranger. And one of the fun things is being able to talk with children from Australia or Hong Kong. So we need to teach our children how to talk to strangers safely, and keep them from talking to them outside of a monitored setting. You also must teach them that anyone can masquerade as anyone else online. The "12-year-old" girl they have been talking to may prove to be forty-five year old man. It's easy for our children to spot an adult in a schoolyard, but not as easy to do the same in cyberspace.

Come straight home after school. Parents over the generations have always known that children can get into trouble when they wander around after school. Wandering aimlessly online isn't any different. Allowing your children to spend unlimited time online, surfing aimlessly, is asking for trouble. If they are just surfing randomly, set a time limit. You want them to come home after they're done, to human interaction and family activities (and homework).

Don't provoke fights. Trying to provoke someone in cyberspace is called "flaming." It often violates the "terms of service" of your online service provider and will certainly get a reaction from other people online - a bad one, and you certainly don't want that. Flaming matches can be heated, long and extended battles, moving from a chat room or discussion group to e-mail quickly. If your child feels that someone is flaming them, they should tell you and the moderator in charge right away and get offline or surf another area. They shouldn't try to defend themselves or get involved in retaliation. It's a battle they can never win.

Don't steal. While downloading music without paying for it, and copying a friend's computer game or software may be common these days, it's still wrong. It's very important that we teach our children how to behave well online. Just because they can take things without paying for them doesn't mean they should. And it also doesn't mean we should turn a blind eye to what they do online, even if it means we save some money in the process. We need to teach our children that being a good citizen means following the rules and laws even if some others don't and even if we think we can get away with it.

Don't tell people personal things about yourself. You never really know who you're talking to online. And even if you think you know who you are talking to, there could be strangers lurking and reading your posts without letting you know that they are there. Don't let your children put personal information on profiles or away messages. It's like writing your personal diary on a billboard.

With children especially, sharing personal information puts them at risk. Make sure your children understand what you consider personal information, and agree to keep it confidential online and everywhere else.

Also teach them not to give away information at Web sites, in order to register or enter a contest, unless they ask your permission first. And, before you give your permission, make sure you have read the Web site's privacy policy, and that they have agreed to treat your personal information, and your child's, responsibly.

We need to get to know your friends. Get to know their online friends, just as you would get to know their

friends in everyday life. Talk to your children about where they go online, and who they talk to. Don't just set up the computer in the corner of their bedroom, and leave them to surf alone. Take a look at their computer monitor every once in awhile; it keeps them honest.

There are many more just as simple as these. When we tell you it's not about technology, it's about parenting and teaching our children solid values of right and wrong, this is what we mean. And it's worth the effort. When our children surf the Internet, they are learning skills that they will need for their future. They become explorers in cyberspace, where they explore ideas and discover new information. Also, because there is no race, gender or disability online, the Internet is the one place where our children can be judged by the quality of their ideas, rather than their physical attributes.

While your children may know more about the technology, you know more about what's right about life. Sit at their side while they compute when you can. It will help you set rules that make sense for your child. It also gives you an unexpected benefit...you'll get a personal computing lesson from the most affordable computer expert you know!

Teach them what you know, and if you're lucky enough...they may teach you what they know too!

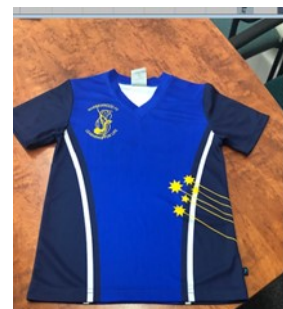

School Council Elections - Information for Parents

WHAT IS A SCHOOL COUNCIL AND WHAT DOES IT DO?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

WHO IS ON THE SCHOOL COUNCIL?

For most school councils, there are three possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected Parent category – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school.
- A mandated elected DET employee category – members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional Community member category – members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. Department employees are not eligible to be Community members.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

WHY IS PARENT MEMBERSHIP SO IMPORTANT?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

DO I NEED SPECIAL EXPERIENCE TO BE ON SCHOOL COUNCIL?

Each member brings their own valuable life skills and knowledge to the role. Councilors may need to develop skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are unfamiliar to them. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

HOW CAN YOU BECOME INVOLVED?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term one each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO STAND FOR ELECTION?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for Nominations following the commencement of Term one each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March unless the usual time line has been varied by the Minister.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

Department employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work are eligible to nominate for parent membership of the school council at that school.

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

REMEMBER

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections.


