## Leadership Conference

Suzanne and I spent Monday and Tuesday at the Regional Principal Conference at the Convention Centre in Melbourne. The entire focus of the convention was about best teaching and learning practice. This yearly opportunity to network and collaborate with other principals was most beneficial and provided for great insights to other schools approaches and practices.

The highlights of the conference were the opportunity to attend a number of key note speakers on educational leadership and evidence-based approaches to learning. I was fortunate to be able to listen to Stephen Dinham from Melbourne University discuss the components of "GREAT TEACHING and Suzanne found Michael Fullan's insights to student engagement in their learning both inspiring and challenging!" It was really reaffirming to hear the work we have been doing as an entire staff over the last couple of years with our gradual release instructional model, the modelling of learning expectations, the implementation of student voice and agency through student owned goals and of course differentiated targeted teaching and learning are all essential as evidenced based approaches to improve student growth in learning.

The conference has also provided us with some questions and opportunities for growth and development with our school's practice as part of the coming review process and strategic plan development. Stay tuned for our parent forums in the coming weeks to support our school review self-reflection and to assist with defining new goals for our learning community in our next school strategic plan taking our school towards 2022. Exciting times!


### Sunday 24 June - Dads and Kids Event - Shrine of Remembrance

### Assistant Principal's Report

**Domain #4 Positive Engagement**-Promoting complete immersion in activities through understanding the nature of engagement, the pathways to it and the function it has on individual wellbeing.

Over the next couple of weeks our students will be given further opportunities to have a voice to allow for deeper learning and engagement with their learning. Prior to the staff planning for the next topic the teachers will give the students an opportunity to inform them of what they know and what they are wondering about or wanting to learn to guide their planning day and engage the students with their learning from their point of need. The students will also be reassessing their learning goals in order to be prepared when they are involved in the 3 way interviews in Week 11. This will avail the students with the opportunity to reflect on their own learning

and how they have progressed according to the goals that have been set by themselves in consultation with their teacher. Authentic student involvement and engagement occurs when decision making is truly shared with the students. As educators, we understand that greater student engagement will encourage student success.

### New First Aid Practices:

In order to improve communication procedures from the Wendy in the First Aid room we have implemented a notice that will be sent home with your child if they have had a minor injury throughout the day. This notice will outline what the injury was and the First Aid that was given. 





# SPEAKING AND LISTENING PROGRAM



## JULY SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

*A group school holiday program that focuses on developing oral language skills.*

This program has been devised by *Word By Mouth Speech Pathology* to support students with oral language difficulties. Our program aims to improve comprehension by developing speaking and listening skills, through an intensive intervention approach. It will also be incorporating material from the *Visualising and Verbalising* program created by Nanci Bell.

Program goals include:

- Expanding vocabulary
- Using a structure for describing scenes and events
- Improving listening comprehension skills
- Improving ability to answer questions about sentences and stories
- Strengthening children's abilities to understand classroom learning

The intervention approaches applied are informed by the latest evidence in the research literature.
