Principal's Report

Uniform at Warranwood PS

Over the last few weeks we have noticed a deterioration in our uniform standard across the school. Many students are thinking that it is ok to wear multi coloured head bands as headwear and many are wearing different types of jackets, shorts and even shirts at school. At Warranwood we have a uniform policy that has been developed over time with input by students, parents and teachers, and it is important that we look to ensure our students understand that items are not optional. Of course, there can be occasions where an exception is required due to weather and even misplaced items. If this is the case parents are asked to provide a note to excuse the non-uniform item that is required for the day. This is very important to support our standards and respect the current uniform policy in place. I have attached the policy for community awareness and information.

Please remember we have a limited 2nd hand uniform facility at the office and welcome any items to be added to our collection for resale in support of sustainable practices. All money raised from our 2nd hand uniform items go towards supporting disadvantaged students in our community to attend excursions and camps.

PARENT SURVEY

About 6 weeks ago,125 randomly selected Warranwood families, received a letter asking them to participate in the 2019 Parent Opinion Survey. We wish to thank the parents who have completed this survey over the month of the survey. The survey closed on Sunday the 18th of August. Although no school can claim to be perfect, our community members continue to work really hard together; staff, students and parent groups alike, for better outcomes, resources and opportunities for all students and families at Warranwood PS. These feedback opportunities are important ways in which we can continue to improve. As always, it's important to list areas that you are happy with and engage our children, as well as suggestions the school can look further towards implementing.

What can we do with the survey results?

Our school will utilise the data in a number of ways to:


- monitor levels of student engagement and wellbeing
- compare school level data on engagement with state-wide benchmarks
- stimulate discussion within the school community about how to improve our parent engagement
- assist in the identification of areas for improvement and professional development needs in the school.

This year we have only received 30 responses which is just a 24% return rate. Even though this is a very small return rate we will look at this feedback when it is available in the coming weeks and share feedback with you via the Connect newsletter.

2019 Student Attitudes to School Survey

A number of months ago our Year 4-6 students participated in the DET state wide online survey exploring a number of key components exploring the climate for learning at Warranwood PS. The feedback from our students gives us some really positive endorsements for the work we are doing in building a differentiated and engaging learning program whilst supporting students to build their emotional intelligence to succeed in the wider world. These survey areas will be explored further in the coming weeks by our school captains as they unpack the results with students from each grade to seek specific areas for growth and development to continue improving.

This year, for the first time we also have data from our graduates of 2018 who completed the survey at their high schools. The students provided feedback on their support with transition and change. As you can see below, we have some solid consistency across the components in the survey from our students. The work we have been doing this year to build student voice and agency skill and awareness with learning through reflective practices and goal setting will hopefully assist with improving our results in 2020. I look forward to receiving the feedback from our school captain led grade forums to inform our new targets.



<u>Prep:</u> Warm up. FMS- play ball kick for accuracy. Game: Kickball. Run to score points. Three field ball and return.




<u>Grade 3 girls</u> – Flower costume is provided by the school and then the girls wear red long sleeved tops and red leggings for the cards.



Vacation Care bookings must be paid for prior to the commencement of Vacation Care. This is done via iPay. If the requested dates on the Vacation Care booking form (on Council's websitel are available, these will be the dates that families will be booked in and charged for.

The Vacation Care program finishes each day at 6pm. If a child is not picked up by this time a late fee will be charged, according to the following scale - \$10 for every 10 minutes or part thereof per family.

No refunds or credits given for days that families have booked and no longer require. Payment is required for all booked days whether children attend the program or not.

 Children must be dressed in clothing appropriate for the weather. In wetter months, please bring a waterproof cost, beanie, umbrells and gum boots. In warmer months, please dress children in 'sun smart' clothing, including covered shoulders and a hat.
- Please make sure your child wears appropriate shoes for playing. No thongs or flip-flops.
- Please label clothing and personal belongings with your child's name so that it can be easily identified.

Food and drinks

- Parents are required to provide nutritious lunches and snacks, such as sandwiches, fruit, cheese sticks, and water. Please send plenty of food for your child to eat
- · Please send a refillable drink bottle with water every
- Please no cans/bottles of soft drink.
- · Please note that we cannot heat or cook children's
- Many excursions do not allow us to take wrappers, we strongly encourage families to re-think your child's lunch box and send non-packaged food each day to the program.

- Children must arrive at the program at least 30 minutes before the stated departure time this will help us to avoid being late for booked activities. The bus will not wait for those who are late.
- If your child will not be attending on an excursion day, please contact the educators at the program before 8.30am to prevent delays in departure
- Please dress appropriately as excursions will run during all weather conditions.
- Children are not to bring money on excursions.
- When travelling by bus we use Ventura bus lines. All buses are fitted with seat belts.
- Educator/child ratio is: 1 educator to every 8 children and for a swimming excursion 1 educator to every 5 children.
- Please make sure your child brings a refillable water bottle and plenty of food with minimal packagaing.

- If a child is to receive medication during the day, parents must complete the Medication Instruction Sheet, and sign the medication in and out with an educator each day.
- Medication must be in the original containers with the original labels and the child's name and specific dosage must be clearly visible on the containers. This also applies to any over the counter medication.

UNIFORM POLICY

RATIONALE

At Warranwood Primary School we believe compulsory school uniform is essential in developing a sense of pride and identification with our school and community. Wearing school uniform maintains and enhances the positive image of the school in the community, as well as creating a sense of equality. For these reasons the School Council has endorsed the compulsory wearing of school uniform by all students.

PURPOSE

- To promote a sense of collective and individual pride and identity in students.
- To promote a sense of belonging to and identification with the school.
- To promote equality among students.
- To project a positive image of our students in the school community and beyond.
- To enable instant recognition of students thus contributing to individual student safety and group security.

GUIDELINES

- The wearing of school uniform is compulsory at Warranwood, in line with current legislative guidelines.
- The range and choice of garments is to be determined by the School Council and only these will be accepted as part of the school uniform.
- Review and amendment of the dress code shall be undertaken by School Council as the need arises.
- All items of school uniform will be selected with regards to the safety of students. Therefore, open-toe sandals, backless shoes, thongs, casual slip-on shoes, earrings (other than studs or small sleepers), bracelets, bangles and necklaces are not acceptable.
- Body piercing, other than earrings is to be covered with tape. Facial piercings other than earrings are not acceptable.
- Cosmetics, including nail polish are not to be worn at school. Extreme hair styles or colours are not permitted.
- Hair ties, ribbons or clips must be navy blue, royal blue or yellow.
- Scarves or gloves are permitted to be worn in winter, but must be plain navy blue, royal blue or yellow.
- Students must wear a Warranwood Primary School hat, either broad brimmed or legionnaire style. The school will ensure that hats will be available for purchase directly from the school.

- The code shall be clearly communicated to parents and students prior to enrolment, thereby providing a basis of assent.
- The dress code shall not discriminate against students on the basis of their gender, race, ethnic group, nationality, religious beliefs, colour or disability.
- Parents may seek exemptions to the Dress Code due to religious or cultural beliefs, student disability or health condition by applying in writing to the Principal.
- Uniform can be purchased online through the school website or PSW website (www.psw.com.au) or at the PSW store in Lusher Rd Croydon.

NB. Non-logo school uniform items may be purchased from department stores. Style, quality, material and colour must be in line with the standard of goods provided by the school supplier.

- The wearing of school uniform is optional on designated free dress days.
 Clothes worm on these days must be in line with the Sunsmart policy.
 Closed-toe footwear must be worn and clothes with inappropriate slogans or images are not permissible.
- Specific Year 6 uniform items may be available to Year 6 students only.

Students not in school uniform:

 If for any reason a student is unable to wear a particular item of school uniform, the parent/guardian should provide a note advising the school of the situation and take appropriate steps to correct the uniform as soon as possible

- Where there is persistent non-compliance with the policy, parents will be asked to discuss the issue with the principal (or delegate)
- Where parents have financial difficulty, they are asked to discuss the issue with the principal (or delegate).
- · Non-compliance with the uniform policy may result in
 - a. withdrawal of permission to represent the school
 - withdrawal of permission to participate in an event which, in the opinion of the principal, is not part of the educational program
 - withdrawal of permission to participate in activities where wearing of official school uniform is a key requirement
 - informing parents or carers of the incident with a view to preventing recurrence
