Principal's Report

Welcome back to Term 3

Welcome back to a busy and exciting Term 3 at Warranwood Primary. We hope the holiday break was both rewarding and relaxing even though the weather was particularly cold over the break. Our Wacky Wednesday student led market and activity stalls day is fast approaching and our Japanese visitors will soon be with us also to enjoy the excitement and craziness of this wonderful day. Our SRC are meeting currently to decide how the funds will be used at school to support students and their experiences.

Later this term our Middle school students will visit Camp Jungai for 3 days to experience Indigenous culture and sustainability focuses. Prep students to please bring bags of lollies to be sorted and regrouped for selling.



PE Overview:
