Excursions

This term, our Year 1 and Year 2 students will have different Inquiry focus areas and will therefore be attending two separate locations for their excursions. Year 1s will be visiting SEALIFE Melbourne Aquarium where they will embark on a guided underwater journey. They will discover sea creatures and underwater habitats with plenty of time to ask their insightful questions and be amazed by ocean wonders! Our Year 2 students will be taking part in an exciting excursion this term, designed to deepen their understanding of early transport, technology, and the environment. They will ride the historic steam train through the Dandenong Ranges and look at how travel has changed, comparing then-and-now. We will require a parent helper for each grade to attend and support students at both excursions. All students are asked to bring a backpack with lunch, snacks and a water bottle. Keep a lookout on Compass for further details, and consent forms. Note that term fees need to be paid prior to the event for students to be able to attend.

Book Week



We will be celebrating Book Week in Week 4 (Monday 11th – Friday 15th August). The theme this year is Book an Adventure! On **Monday 11th August**, students are invited to dress up as their favourite book character, author or other book-inspired costume and take part in our whole-school Book Week parade.

Later in the week, Melbourne-based children's author **Michael Wagner** will be visiting our school and share his books including acclaimed picture books *Why I Love Footy* and *Bear Make Den* as well as *Dirt By Sea* which was shortlisted for the 2023 CBCA Picture Book of the Year award.

TERM 2 LEARNING IN THE JUNIOR SCHOOL In our Year One classes, we will begin the term by focussing on measuring length, where we will be **Numeracy:** enjoying practical measurement activities using informal units. We will then develop our understandings of patterns including number patterns and skip counting. Sharing and grouping, our early multiplication and division concepts, will form our focus towards the end of term, where students will use practical modelling or physical materials to solve problems involving equal sharing and grouping, and begin exploring calculation strategies to solve problems. In our Year Two classes, we will begin the term by exploring different types of maps and their features, learning how to give directions and interpret map symbols. Later, we will focus on multiplication and division to further develop our number skills and then focus on shape to be able to recognise, compare and classify shapes, and use terms such as opposite, curved and straight. Literacy: This term, we will continue the implementation of InitiaLit-1 (Year One) and InitiaLit-2 (Year 2) in our Junior School classes. InitiaLit is a literacy program that teaches children how to read and spell through daily Reading, lessons, using explicit research-based teaching methods. It also uses a range of engaging storybooks to Writing, develop children's vocabulary and oral language. Students across the Junior School will participate in Speaking & daily reading, writing, spelling, grammar and oral language activities, with their progress monitored Listening closely by their class teachers. Inquiry: This term Junior school students will be exploring the topic of DISCOVERY. Year 1 students will explore the beaches, seas and oceans and will be led by their own curiosity and sense of adventure! They will Yr 2-Geography & discover the features of beaches and oceans, the creatures that live there and the connection that History people, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, have to our beaches and seas. The Year Two students are Discovering Australia: through a mentor text of 'Under the Southern Cross'. They will explore the states, capital cities and towns around Australia and their features which tell stories about people, culture, and history.

Share Time

Share Time is a valuable opportunity for students to build their speaking and listening skills. Each fortnight, your child will be given a focus topic to present to their classmates. We encourage you to support them in preparing for their presentation so they feel confident, ready to share, and able to answer questions on their assigned day. Please see your class teacher if you do not have the class roster for Term 2.

Junior School Sport

This term, Junior School students will be the FMS (Fundamental participating in Skills) Movement program on Monday afternoons. The four Junior School teachers will be running multi-age skill-based activities on a rotation, helping students develop essential movement skills such as throwing, catching, jumping, and balancing.

What's SWPBS?

We follow the SWPBS (School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support) approach to promote a safe and respectful learning environment for all students. As part of this framework, students can earn positive acknowledgement **Gotcha Tokens** when they demonstrate our school values. These tokens help reinforce positive behaviour and contribute to class and school-wide rewards.



Attendance Records

As you may know, your child's attendance is recorded on Compass. Any absences, late arrivals, or early departures go directly through Compass. It is important that you use the system to notify the school if your child will be away or arriving late on any day. If your child is late/departing early your child's teacher needs a receipt from the Compass Kiosk at the front office. Please note that classroom rolls are marked at approximately 9:05 am each day, so students arriving after this time will be marked as late and must be signed in at the office Kiosk upon arrival.

Home Reading - MultiLit eLibrary

It has been wonderful to see our Year 1 and 2 students accessing the **MultiLit eLibrary** at home to support their reading development. This online resource provides students with access to carefully levelled decodable texts that align with the InitiaLit programs taught in the Junior School classes.

The books are designed to reinforce the phonics skills your child is learning, helping them build confidence and fluency in reading. Students can log in at home via the QR code in their diary front cover, and read/revisit texts at their own pace. These books contain familiar sounds and words, making them ideal for independent reading practice. At the end of each book, you'll find **comprehension questions** designed to check your child's understanding of the text. We encourage you to go through these questions with your child, as it helps develop deeper thinking and discussion around what they've read.

We warmly welcome communication between home and school, and encourage parents to reach out with any questions or concerns. If you would like to speak with your child's teacher, you're welcome to send an email to arrange a meeting time, or come to the classroom door from 8:45am for a quick chat.
